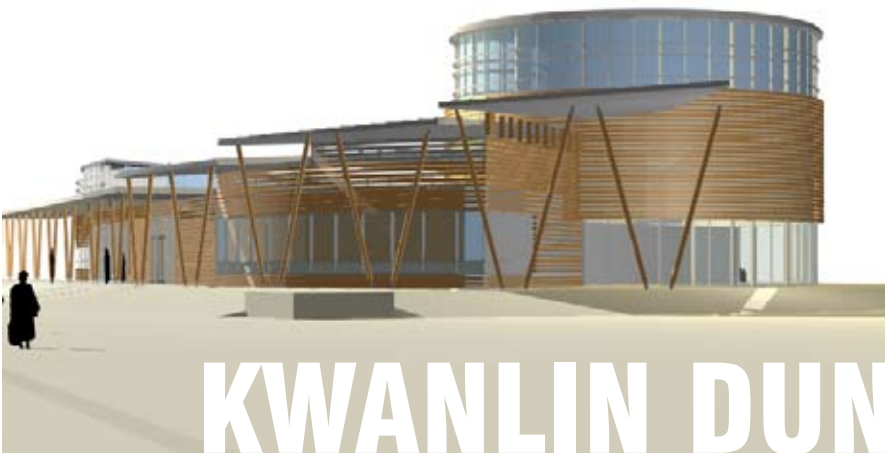


The proposed Kwanlin Dun First Nation Cultural Centre was one of the central components of the KDFN land claims agreement. The proposed 3,500 square metre building was to commence construction in early 2008.

The proposed Centre is expected to be a visual landmark on the redeveloped downtown waterfront and will herald a return of the first nations people to the banks of the Yukon River.

The building includes a performance hall (with seating for 500), multi-purpose meeting rooms, interpretive exhibit, artist work areas and a large administrative/office component.

The building utilizes local building materials by incorporating heavy timber wood components. Natural daylight floods the building throughout the year and glazing provides unparalleled views up the Yukon River toward Grey Mountain.
